

Spanish | Using Gustar – Present Tense

Gustar in the 'I' and singular form:

Spanish	Literal Translation	Translation
Gustar	To like (infinitive)	To like (infinitive)
Me gusta	*it* pleases me	I like

Gustar in all the singular forms:

Spanish	Literal Translation	Translation
Me gusta	*it* pleases me	I like
Te gusta	*it* pleases you	You like
Le gusta	*it* pleases her/him	He/she likes
Nos gusta	*it* pleases us	We like
Os gusta	*it* pleases you (pl.)	You (pl.) like
Les gusta	*it* pleases them	They like

Gustar if the direct OBJECT is plural:

Spanish	Literal Translation	Translation
Me gustan	*it* pleases me	I like
Te gustan	*it* pleases you	You like
Le gustan	*it* pleases her/him	He/she likes
Nos gustan	*it* pleases us	We like
Os gustan	*it* pleases you (pl.)	You (pl.) like
Les gustan	*it* pleases them	They like

***it* = Object**

Examples:

Me gusta el cuarto

I like the room



Object is singular, therefore me **gusta** is used
used

Nos gustan los libros

We like the books



Object is plural, therefore nos **gustan** is used
used
